#### WHAT DO I OFFER?

Over the next eight years we revitalized the Mission; and found competent Sri Lankan leadership for it. Although Kay and I will always be connected with the Paynter Home – it was started by her family – it is now appropriate that we seek to use our gifts in Canada.

In Sri Lanka I adjusted to the conditions of a Third World culture living and working, with mutual acceptance and respect; among all strata of society as the need arose.

Strong communication, organizational and administrative skills have been demonstrated in senior levels of business management, both line and staff positions in the Canadian Armed Forces (Reserve) and lay and ordained ministry both in Canada and abroad.

My experience in adult education includes being the manager of advanced agent education at a North American Life, the Chief Instructor of a number of training programs in the Canadian Armed Forces Reserve, and a tutor at the School of Philosophy in Toronto.
